Nonprofits can lobby, too

A few eyebrows were raised 21/2 years ago when United Way of Central Indiana named Andrew Cullen as its lobbyist. A few nonprofits questioned his appointment, primarily because they thought that nonprofits could not lobby.

And while in fact, nonprofits are allowed to lobby, Cindy Booth of Child Advocates believes that the perception still exists. She's the executive director of the nonprofit that advocates for abused and neglected children in Marion County.



"I think people, boards and directors, executive directors are generally uninformed about what they can do and worry about the risk of getting in trouble. So they do nothing or they call it educating," said Booth. Nationally last year, 280 nonprofits spent nearly \$36 million lobbying, according to Open Secrets.org, which tracks the lobbying industry. How to Take a Public Policy Stand, with sample criteria

When the Colorado Association for Recycling was approached to endorse the No Child Left Inside legislation, they didn't know WHAT to decide, but they did know HOW to decide. They already had a procedure in place for deciding which public policy stands to take.

But many nonprofits aren't as prepared: Would it support your cause or help your constituencies if your organization took an official stand on a public policy issue? Is it legal to do so? And how would you go about it? Your board may be thinking of taking a stand on an international issue, on FDA regulations, on public school policies for students with disabilities, on a proposed hospital closure, on pending legislation, or on whether dogs should be allowed in a local park.

The worst time to decide on how to take a policy position is when an issue suddenly erupts. Having a policy or procedure in place before a controversy develops. Eliminate the need for the board to make two difficult decisions at the same time: HOW to take a stand, and WHETHER to take a particular stand. [Read more.](#)

Learn to love lobbying

What do Mothers Against Drunk Driving and the National Beer Wholesalers Association have in common? How are the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids and Philip Morris similar? What do the Love Canal Homeowners Association and Hooker Chemical Company share?

They all know that if you want to change the world, you have to lobby local, state, and federal governments.

Legislative action is often the best way to bring about the stable, sweeping changes that nonprofits crave. And yet nonprofits routinely forfeit their right to lobby, finds the Strengthening Nonprofit Advocacy Project (SNAP), a survey of more than 1,700 national nonprofits conducted in 2001 by Tufts University, OMB Watch, and the Center for Lobbying in the Public Interest. (See chart on p. 59 for a definition of lobbying.) Although many nonprofits have lobbied once or a few times in the past, very few make lobbying a regular activity. [Read more.](#)
