The legend of Tom Brady has grown thanks to charming images of his celebrated appearances for Best Buddies International, a nonprofit dedicated to helping intellectually and developmentally disabled people.

Smiling children, adoring spectators, and a beaming Brady embracing those with disabilities: No other undertaking in his 17 years in Boston has more vividly portrayed the New England Patriots star as a fabulously wealthy sports figure committed to charity.

Over the last few months, the media has become a target of criticism. The reasons for this are manifold - ranging from the rise of social media to a click-based economy under which outlets operate - but they have all led to the creation of the "fake news"-moniker to brand both reporting that is either factually untrue or too opinionated for one's liking.

Enter the largest newspaper in New England, the Boston Globe. It launched a campaign titled "Facts Matter" to emphasize how important and critical correct reporting has become in the present day and age. And to its credit, the facts presented in the recently published article titled "Tom Brady gives much to Best Buddies, but has taken millions for his own charitable trust" are impressive.

The conclusions drawn based on the facts, on the other hand, will only add to the - justified or not - distrust many Americans have in the media. In summary those conclusions read like this: It is good that New England Patriots quarterback Tom Brady has helped Best Buddies raise \$46.5 million since 2001. However, it is bad that \$3.25 million of those have been redistributed to other charitable causes Brady supports. Read more.



New nonprofit puts money over mission and ethics

On the Facebook page of the National Association of Nonprofit Organizations & Executives -- or Nance -- you'll find a picture of its five board members holding up checks they've received in front of a large room of people. The photo was taken at the group's first conference in Columbia, S.C., earlier this month.

The checks are the board members' payments for their services: They each get \$1,000 a day for in-person meetings, plus travel reimbursement and \$300 an hour for board meetings held by phone.

The payments -- Nanoe calls them "honorariums" -- are rare among nonprofits: Less than 1 percent of organizations pay board members such a fee for service, and about 1 percent pay them a salary, according to BoardSource, a national organization that seeks to improve nonprofit governance.
