
What studies say about college readiness

For as long as there have been public schools in the United States, Americans have wrestled over the mission of those schools. Should their guiding purpose be to turn new immigrants into loyal citizens? To prepare children for active participation in democratic life? To sort them by aptitude and steer them into appropriate occupations?

When it comes to such basic questions about the goals of public education, things have never been clear or settled. But that could be changing. From a wide range of education advocacy groups, associations, think tanks, and state and federal policymakers, one now hears a remarkably consistent message: The most critical mission for K-12 education is to prepare students for higher education. Among school reformers, "college readiness" has become a ubiquitous rallying cry.

But for all of the recent buzz about college readiness, it is difficult to say what that term means, how such readiness might be measured, or what schools might do to produce it. [Read more.](#)





Reports show improvements in college readiness

The Indiana Commission for Higher Education says while improvements have been made, nearly one-fifth of Hoosier high school graduates are not academically prepared for college. Indiana's 2017 College Readiness Reports show half of general diploma recipients required remediation in college.

The commission says, overall, the trend toward college readiness is positive, but disparities remain. About one-fifth of Core 40 diploma recipients required remediation, while only 3 percent of honors graduates needed remediation, according to the reports.

"Students who finish high school academically prepared are more likely to complete college, graduate on time and spend less on their degrees," said Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education Teresa Lubbers. "The overall trend is encouraging, but more must be done to align Indiana's high school diploma standards with the expectations of colleges and employers." [Read more.](#)



Accountability, college & career readiness

A few days later, I read a new report by the Council of Chief State School Officers called "Destination Known: Valuing College and Career Readiness in State Accountability Systems," prepared by the Education Strategy Group. The report is thorough, thoughtful and specific. It appears to reflect the state of the art in this arena in the United States today. And, in so doing, it reveals how big the gap is between global best practice and typical American practice.

Those of you who read the earlier blog will recall that in top-performing education systems, qualifications systems are designed so that at the end of each stage of a student's progression through the school system, and then from high school to college and career, there are examinations and performance assessments intended to determine whether the student has met the qualifications for moving on to the next stage. 
