

A new model for citizen engagement

In 2013, the city of Birmingham, Ala., implemented Love Your Block, a nationwide program that awards small grants to local volunteer groups that propose projects that will improve their neighborhoods. Before issuing a request for proposals, the city conducts extensive outreach to those groups to hear their concerns and to discuss potential solutions on which they and various city agencies can collaborate.

The groups then develop and submit proposals, and the city makes a series of grants, which range in size from \$500 to \$2,000. Staff members from city



agencies also work with the neighborhood groups to help them implement their projects. Throughout this process, citizen volunteers engage directly with local officials in setting priorities for civic improvement. And they achieve concrete results: As of January 2015, Love Your Block volunteers in 16 Birmingham neighborhoods had removed more than 26,000 square feet of graffiti, disposed of more than 167,000 pounds of trash and debris, planted more than 500 trees, and revitalized 117 blocks.

As impressive as those outputs are, Love Your Block has also generated broad social outcomes.

Is it time for a new presidential debate format?

Drop dead."

Fast forward 60 years, and American voters now have new ways to vent in real time, this year tweeting and Snapchatting and Facebooking their views about which US presidential candidate --Hillary Clinton or Donald Trump -- is better qualified for the White House. According to Twitter spokesman Nick Pacilio, Monday night's 90minute televised presidential debate was the "most tweeted debate ever," expected to exceed the 10.3 million tweets tallied during the first US presidential debate in 2012. <u>Read more.</u>



Mark Zuckerberg and Priscilla Chan's \$3 billion effort aims to rid world of major diseases by end of century

Facebook co-founder Mark Zuckerberg and his wife, Priscilla Chan, announced a \$3 billion effort to accelerate scientific research with the wildly ambitious goal of "curing all disease in our children's lifetime."

The many components of the initiative include creating universal technology "tools" based on both traditional science and engineering on which all researchers can build, including a map of all cell types, a way to continuously monitor blood for early signs of illness, and a chip that can diagnose all diseases (or at least many of them). The money will also help fund what they referred to as 10 to 15 "virtual institutes" that will bring together investigators from around the world to focus on individual diseases or other goals -- an idea that has the potential to upend biomedical science. <u>Read more.</u>

Presidential campaigns and philanthropy

As Election Day approaches, nonprofit leaders might be worrying that the big money donated to the presidential campaigns will lead to smaller results in their nonprofits' next fundraising campaigns.

That's understandable since, according to American National Election Studies, 40 percent of Americans contribute to political candidates, parties or PACs. As the primary season concluded in mid-June, the Center for Responsive Politics reported that nearly \$1.3 billion had been raised by individual candidates and super PACs to support various presidential contenders. This already is

more than half of the total spent in 2012 by President Obama and Republican contender Mitt Romney, who raised and expended nearly \$2.4 billion on their campaigns.

While these dollar amounts are substantial, campaign account receipts are subpar when compared with Americans' philanthropic activity. According to Giving USA 2016, \$373.25 billion was donated to nonprofits in 2015. Of that total, nearly \$265 billion was provided by individuals. Read more.
