It's not so.

This is clear in a project called the Schools of Opportunity, launched a few years ago by educators who sought to highlight public high schools that actively seek to close



opportunity gaps through research-proven practices and not standardized test scores (which are more a measure of socioeconomic status than anything else). Read more.

Social entrepreneurs' dilemma: Convincing investors they're not too risky

A recent report underscores something that keeps cropping up in the world of social enterprise: Early-stage companies have a hard time finding impact investors, who regard many such startups as too risky.

That's according to research conducted by Echoing Green and Enclude. Echoing Green, a 30-year-old nonprofit, works with emerging leaders in the nonprofit, for-profit and hybrid world, to develop their skills. For the past three years, it's also run an impact investing program. Enclude is an advisory firm focused on building local economies.

The report includes data from 49 of Echoing Green's 120 fellows, plus information from focus groups. "There's a lot of hubbub around mainstreaming capital into impact investing, but we wanted to elevate the voices of entrepreneurs," says Min Pease, Echoing Green's director of impact investing. "We found that there are some big funding and market-level challenges." Read more.
