Pulliam Trust hones its environmental giving

It's no secret that Nina Mason Pulliam was passionate about animals and nature. As a community leader, and a newspaper publisher in Arizona and Indiana, she supported those causes, and others, in multiple ways.

Now, nearly 20 years after her death with the establishment of a 50-year-limited legacy Trust that bears her name, those two passions are still championed. What has changed recently are the defined priorities for environmental giving.



When Harriet Ivey, the Trust's first leader, retired three years ago, Gene D'Adamo was hired to continue its legacy. Ivey had been at the helm as president and CEO during the Trust's first 15 years, and laid a strong foundation.

"As with any foundation, as it gains experience and community knowledge, its focus narrows," said D'Adamo. "We could only do what we're doing now, because of what Harriet had laid. She took an organization from nothing, and established the Trust." [Read more.](#)



Wellness on the White River

More than 5 miles of wilderness trails and 210 acres of wildlife habitat hide along the White River waterway in downtown Indianapolis, but remain largely underused by nearby neighborhoods. With improvements to the New York Street Bridge, Reconnecting to Our Waterways aims to boost well-being by connecting Near Westside residents to zones of physical activity and active play.

Most Indianapolis residents would be surprised to learn that a quarter marathon-length waterfront trail exists in the heart of downtown. Red-tailed hawks, deer, beaver, osprey, and great-horned owls all call the Urban Wilderness Trail along the White River home. The trails offer a peaceful break from city life, but also a breathtaking backdrop to stay physically active. Paved bike trails above run parallel to crushed limestone and grass trails below by the river—offering recreation options to cyclists, walkers, runners, with soft surfaces amenable to those with knee problems and limited mobility. 


