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Connecting teens to jobs

Marie Mackintosh rises to challenges.

In 2016, when Indianapolis Mayor Joe Hogsett announced a new focus on collaborative workforce development, he





also named a new EmployIndy's leadership team -- Angela Carr Klitzch as president and chief executive officer and Marie Mackintosh as chief operating officer.

And while running the nonprofit that oversees multiple federal, state, and local workforce development activities for Marion County is a gargantuan task, a bigger hurdle was engaging and getting the city's young people employed.



The data was challenging. In 2014, the Brookings Institution released a 12-year longitudinal study that examined youth employment rates in the 100 largest U.S. metropolitan areas. What they found was troubling. Labor participation for ages 16 to 19, had fallen from 49 percent to 28 percent. Added to that was another report by The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that teen employment had declined with every recession since 1979, and was projected to further decline through 2024. Tech firm donates \$50K for Hogsett's youth employment project

Tech company Genesys Telecommunications Laboratories Inc. announced Wednesday it would donate \$50,000 to support the city of Indianapolis' growing summer youth employment initiative, Project Indy.

Genesys, which acquired Indianapolis-based Interactive Intelligence Group Inc. for \$1.4 billion in 2016 in the second-largest tech company sale in the state's history, said it wanted to support the city's tech sector by boosting the youth pipeline.



"The talent pipeline continues to be incredibly important to us," said Todd Pedersen, Genesys' vice president of corporate affairs. "Adding value early on is going to help all the tech ecosystem in Indy over a period of time. We feel like no matter what they're doing, just getting those first skills early on, that they can build on, gives them a vision for what is possible in the future."

The donation is the largest single gift in Project Indy's short history. Hogsett started the initiative in 2016. Last summer, it supported about 2,000 teens and young adults in summer jobs. Read more.

The case for internal controls

The core of any organization's fraud-prevention program is strong internal controls. Yet too many nonprofits either fail to develop controls that address common risks, or if they establish controls, neglect to enforce them. Your nonprofit must do both if it wants to help prevent occupational theft and fraud perpetrated by outsiders.



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Charities at risk

According to the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE), billing fraud, check tampering and expense reimbursement fraud are the three most common types of employee theft found in religious, charitable and social service organizations. But proper segregation of duties -- for example, assigning account reconciliation and fund depositing to two different staff members -- is a relatively easy and effective

method of preventing such fraud.

For all types of organizations, such controls as strong management oversight, regular audits and confidential fraud hotlines are associated with decreases in financial losses. The ACFE has found that proactive data monitoring and analysis is the most effective means of limiting the duration and cost of fraud schemes -- 50 percent shorter and 60 percent smaller than organizations that don't monitor data. 

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
